ORDINANCE NUMBER - 1985-3

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1982-3, AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A COMPREHENSIVE SYSTEM FOR THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF ALL GARBAGE WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF WEST NEWTON AND PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HERewith IN ORDER TO REDUCE THE RATES TO BE CHARGED FOR THE COLLECTION OF GARBAGE

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Town Council of the Borough of West Newton, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 5 c.(1) of Ordinance No. 1982-3 is hereby amended to read:

Section 5 Collection Practices

c. Rates and charges for collection.

- (1) Each private family residential customer shall pay the Borough or its authorized Collector the sum of Ten and no/100 (\$10.00) Dollars quarterly in advance or Thirty-eight and no/100 (\$38.00) Dollars annually in advance (by January 31). This rate shall be based on a maximum of four (4) containers not weighing more than forty (40) pounds, when filled. Any person requiring additional collections or collections

in excess of the quantity hereinabove set forth shall negotiate a fair and equitable rate for such additional collections or additional quantities, or both, directly with the Collector.

SECTION 2: Section 5 c.(3) of Ordinance No. 1982-3 is hereby amended to read:

Section 5 Collection Practices

c. Rates and charges for collection.

(3) Each senior citizen who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older and who is the head of a household that contains no other wage earner shall pay the Borough or its authorized Collector the sum of Eight and 50/100 (\$8.50) Dollars quarterly in advance or Thirty-two and no/100 (\$32.00) Dollars annually in advance (by January 31). This rate shall be based on a maximum of four (4) containers not weighing more than forty (40) pounds, when filled. Any person requiring additional collections or collections in excess of the quantity hereinabove set forth shall negotiate a fair and equitable rate for such additional collections or additional quantities, or both, directly with the Collector.

SECTION 3: Any ordinance or part of an ordinance in conflict with the

terms of this Ordinance is, and the same are, hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall become effective on January 1, 1986.
